Any **Preliminary exam** is consist of Four main subjects – **Mathematics, General Intelligence, English & General Awareness**

Mathematics: It's one of the main subjects of any **competitive exam**. In any preliminary level exam the math problems are mostly came from class 9th an 10th standard. The chapters are –

Number system, Number Series, Simplification, HCF and LCM, Simple and decimal fractions, square root and cube root, Indices and surds, Percentage, Discount, Profit and Loss, Average, Simple interest, Compound interest, Ratio and Proportion, Mixture and Alligation, Partnership, Work and Time, Work and Wages, Age based problems, Pipe and Cistern, Speed-time and distance (Trains related problems, Boats & Streams), Probability, Area and perimeter, Volume and Surface area, Geometry, Basic Co-ordinate Geometry, Basic Trigonometry, Height & Distance, Data table, Bar chart and Pie Chart.

If you can **Complete this Common Combined Syllabus for Math** then you can easily attempt 80 – 90% questions in any preliminary exam.

General Intelligence: Like Mathematics General Intelligence is one of main subjects for any competitive exam. It's the easiest subject to score but most of the candidate doesn't know about the complete syllabus of GI to prepare. Let's see the all chapters of GI for any Govt competitive Exam –

English: It's the most common subject of any Government competitive exam. The basic and common topics of English are –

Fill in the blanks and sentence correction based on part of speech (noun, pronoun, adjective, verb, adverb, preposition, conjunction and interjection), Article, Tense, Collective nouns, gender and number. Cloze test, sequence of sentence, synonyms, antonyms, one word substitution, idiom and phrases, group verbs, voice change and narration change.

General Awareness: The main focus of this section is to understand how much aware you are about your circumstances. It's basically the applied version of **General Knowledge**.

General Awareness consists of a few important subjects those are –

Basic general knowledge (Sports, Movies, Music, Awards, Achievements, Important Personalities, National & International Organizations, About your Country, About your State & other Basic General Knowledge), History, Geography, Life science, Physical science, Indian polity, Indian Constitution, Economics, Environmental science and Current Affairs.
